

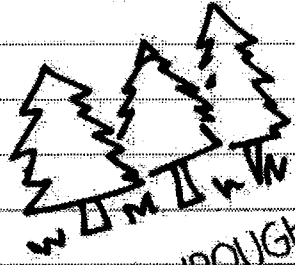
ALLITERATION

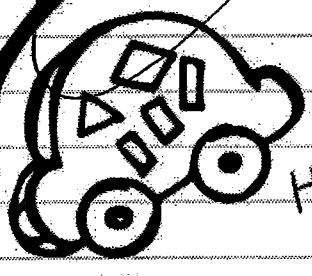

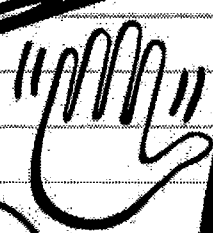

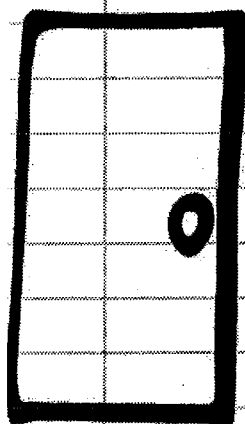
PERSONIFICATION

PERSONIFICATION GIVES HUMAN CHARACTERISTICS TO INANIMATE OBJECTS, ANIMALS, OR IDEAS.

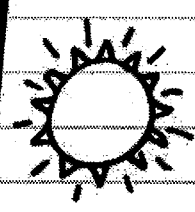

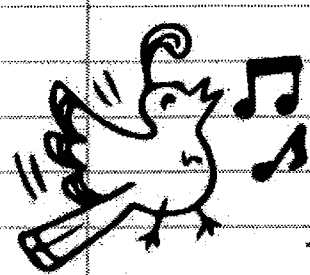
